Outdoor Education

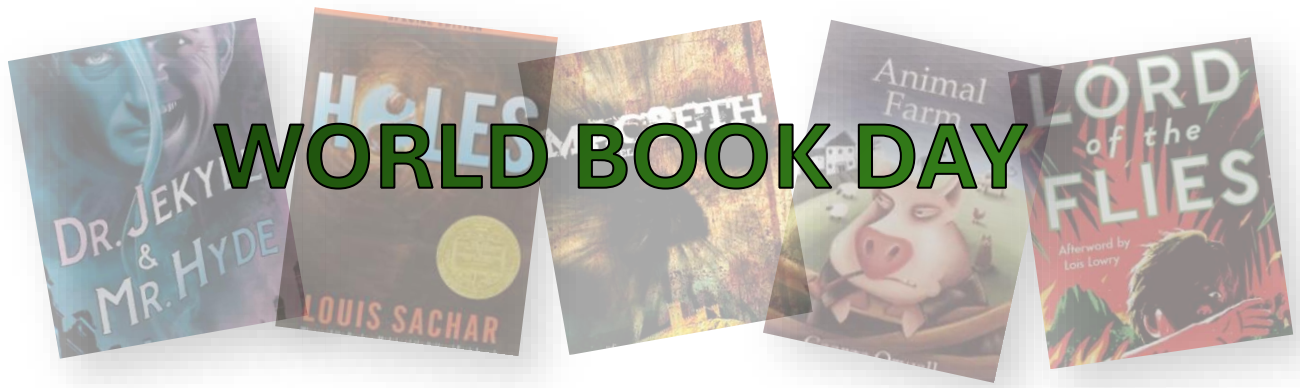
March has been a great month for Outdoor Education. There have been lots of activities going on and, with the better weather starting to move in, more time outside!

Well done to all for a great March, let's hope the April showers hold off!



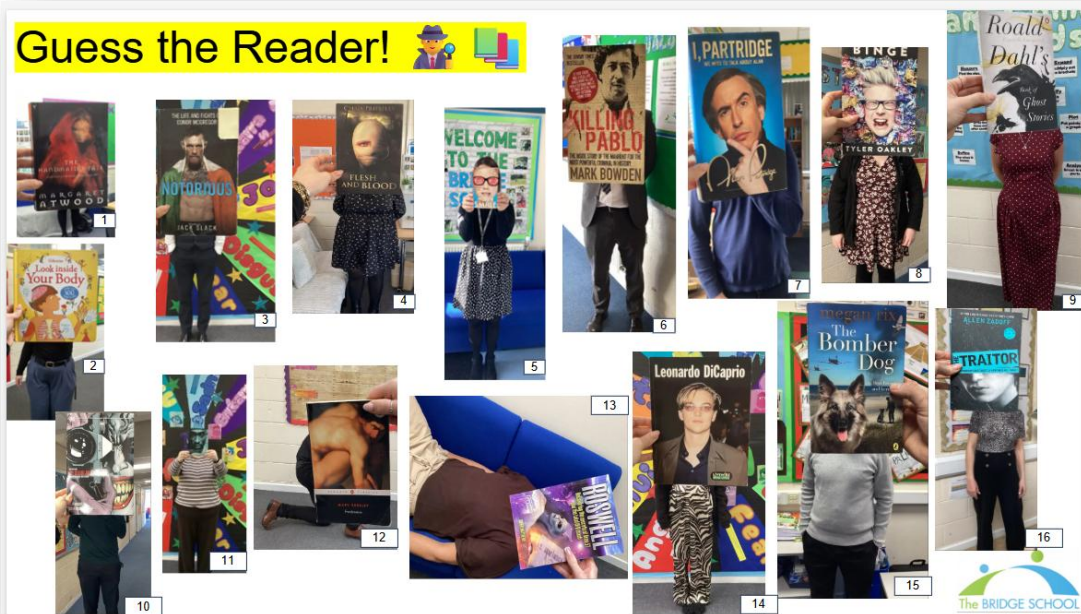


Students across KS3 and KS4 at The Bridge celebrated World Book Day with a range of engaging reading activities throughout the day.

Students took part in a World Book Day quiz, testing their knowledge of books, authors and characters. Another highlight was the 'Guess the Reader' challenge, where students tried to identify members of staff from photos of them reading some of their favourite books.

In lessons, reading was explored across the curriculum. In English, students annotated song lyrics to explore deeper meanings and language choices. In Science, students read a section of *George's Marvellous Medicine* before creating mixtures and using scientific separating techniques to purify the solutions they had made.

Students were encouraged to read in varying tones, voices and styles across all other subjects on the day. The day was a great reminder that reading can appear in many different forms - and as Dr. Seuss famously said, "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go."





The Apprentice Engineer, Chloe, came in and spoke to the groups about the different houses being built at the Sandymoor development. Students also took part in a group competition to build a square miniature house by following detailed plans. The next session will be focussing on the skills and qualities required to work in the construction industry with the final session of the term being a visit to the site at Sandymoor.
